The Facilities Management at the University of Kentucky is seeking an outstanding professional to provide technical leadership, expertise, and support to the Geographical Information System (GIS) services area which manages the University's enterprise GIS systems. The GIS Analyst will create, manage and maintain geospatial analysis products, cartographic products, geometric & transportation network-based datasets, multi-modal routes, travel directions, utility flow directions, origin-destination cost matrices and other sophisticated routing and service area analysis. The position will also be responsible for managing GIS departmental standards and procedures while following 'lean' principles including developing custom routines to automate GIS tasks and workflows that support the following areas: geometric networks, versioned databases, logical queries for spatial analysis and map production, quality assurance and control (QA/QC), 3D datasets, image based data, elevation data, map templates, metadata, and other facility libraries. The successful applicant must be able to produce high-quality maps and other graphical outputs to meet University needs, employ geospatial technologies to disseminate GIS, and to produce GIS products that support utility and interior space analysis. Additional responsibilities of the position include providing GIS technical support, researching, evaluating, and recommending software, product testing, assisting with the design of the software applications and GIS-based web and desktop software.

The minimum qualifications for this position are a Bachelor's degree and 3 years of related work experience or an equivalent combination of education and related work experience. Qualified candidates must have knowledge of ArcGIS, CASE Tools, Microsoft Office, SQL Server, SQL, XML, ArcObjects, ModelBuilder, PhotoShop, AutoCAD and Cartographic product development expertise. This position requires excellent communication skills, both verbal and written. GISP certification preferred.
