The IndianaMap is a single statewide map for Indiana. It includes the information people need most in a format that is accessible to both mapping experts and the general public.



The Indiana Geographic Information Council, an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit, is part of a team working to create the IndianaMap by gaining consensus on data needs, building the map, educating people on its use, and making it widely available.

Indiana needs a single, accurate, high-quality, digital map because...

1. Digital maps should be made once and paid for once
2. Better informed decision-makers make better decisions
3. Emergency responders need maps that span city and county lines
4. Pooling resources saves taxpayer dollars
5. Access to information empowers citizens

But more than just a map, the IndianaMap is the process of pulling all this information together, finding ways to store and update it, and making it available to people who need it.

A coalition of government, academic, nonprofit and private organizations are building the IndianaMap.

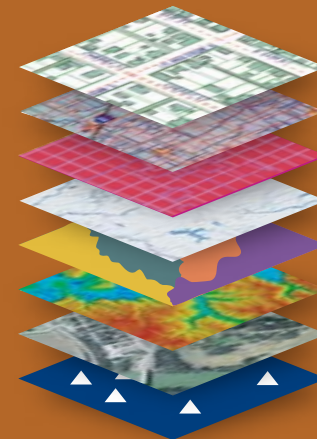
Where does the information come from?
